2022 SHOW JUMPING RULEBOOK

The 2022 rulebook is now available online and through Shop Pony Club. Edits and clarifications (red font) were made, and the entire rulebook was formatted in a new program. The fundamental changes are listed below:

Article 1: Changes made to the definition of a rally.

Article 10: The mount substitution process changed.

Article 12: Policy 0860 and 0860.P1 received updates.

Article 36: General Barn Attire changed.

Section III: Scoring information was updated.

USPC SHOW JUMPING CHAMPIONSHIPS

USPC is pleased to host Championships East and West in 2022. See the Championships Competition Resources page of the USPC website for additional eligibility information. The Guidebook to Championships will be posted in March.

Championships West

The competition will take place at Twin Rivers Ranch in Paso Robles, CA. Limited cross-entering permitted. See the Guidebook to Championships West for specifics. Move-in Tuesday, July 5, and compete July 6 - 8.

Championships East

The competition will take place at the Tryon International Equestrian Center. Cross-entering is not permitted. All competitors must be moved in by Thursday, July 28, and compete July 29 - 31.

ROUNDS AT CHAMPIONSHIPS

Championships Divisions

Advanced and Developing Horse/Rider Divisions

Competitors in standard Championships will ride five rounds. Four of the five rounds will be knockdown rounds, one of which will also be scored as an Equitation round and one of which will be followed by a Jump-off for all competitors who meet the Jump off criteria. The fifth round will be a Two-Phase (aka Power and Speed) round.

Introductory Divisions

Competitors in standard Championships will ride five knockdown rounds, one of which will also be judged as an Equitation round. Two rounds will be designated as Optimum Time rounds, and competitors can receive bonus points.

Modified Championships Divisions

Developing Horse/Rider Divisions

Competitors in modified Championships will ride three rounds. Two of the three rounds will be knockdown rounds, one of which will also be scored as an Equitation round and one of which will be followed by a Jump-Off for all competitors who meet the Jump off criteria. One round will be designated an Optimum Time round.

Introductory Divisions

Competitors in modified Championships will ride three knockdown rounds, one of which will also be judged as an Equitation round. Two rounds will be designated as Optimum Time rounds, and competitors can receive bonus points.

CHAMPIONSHIPS ELIGIBILITY

A reminder that C-3/B/A Eventing/Show Jumping certified members are not required to participate at a regional Show Jumping rally to attend Championships. To enter, they must have the permission of their regional supervisor (RS).

Championships Divisions

Riders must complete three rounds at the competition level with 12 or fewer jumping faults and no elimination in the designated rounds. One round must be scored as an equitation round and a jumper round.

If no standard rally is available in discipline. Submit judges' cards from three rounds at the USPC competition level height and meet the current fault parameters by divisions. Also, participate in a mounted standard regional rally as a rider at the minimum HM certification the level.

Modified Championships Divisions

Rider must participate in a standard or modified regional Show Jumping rally and complete a minimum of two rounds at the competition level with 24 fewer jumping faults and not be eliminated in either round.

If no standard or modified rally is available in discipline. Submit judges' cards from three rounds at the USPC competition level height and meet the current fault parameters by divisions. Also, participate in a mounted standard regional rally as a rider at the minimum HM certification level.

Exceptions

Competition eligibility exception requests will be handled on a case-by-case basis. There are no exceptions to the age or certification requirements. The RS must submit all competition exception requests using the online system, www.ponyclub.org/Events/Championships/CompetitorInformation.aspx.

Mount Substitution

Mount substitution requests will be handled on a case-by-case basis. All mount substitution requests must be submitted by the RS using the online system, www.ponyclub.org/Events/Championships/CompetitorInformation.aspx.

2022 USPC USEF PONY JUMPER TEAM

Since 2002, the USPC Show Jumping Committee has supported a team that represents USPC at the National Pony Jumper Championships at the USEF Pony Finals, held at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington, KY. There are three nights of competition – the Individual Phase 1 takes place on the first night – on the second night, team members ride two rounds for the Team competition and finish with the Individual Finals on the last night.
