

POLICY 6006P PROCEDURES FOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

A. General

1. The term “Championship” refers to any final competition that is organized by the USPC National Office. There may be one or more Championships in a year.
2. Championships are the responsibility of the Activities Director in consultation with the Vice President of Activities (VPA).
3. All USPC Championships are conducted according to the USPC discipline rulebooks, annual newsletters and specified competition documentation.
4. The Activities Director, in consultation with the VPA, shall submit budgets for approval by the Board of Governors in accordance with Board Policy #7400.
5. Staff and officials for Championships must be approved by the Activities Director in consultation with the VPA.
6. Chief Horse Management Judges must be chosen from the current published Chief Horse Management Judges list in consultations with the Director and Vice President of Instruction (VPI).
7. All mounted Championships shall include Horse Management.

B. Eligibility of Competitors

To be eligible for a Championship, competitors must qualify per the discipline requirements as specified in the USPC discipline rulebooks, annual newsletters, competition documentation, and by the Board of Governors.

C. Selection of Dates and Sites

1. The Activities Director, in consultation with the VPA, shall consider the suitability of all proposed site(s) and date(s), and make a recommendation to PAC.
2. Championships for designated disciplines shall be held at the same site(s) unless specific permission for separate Championships has been recommended by the Activities Director in consultation with the VPA and approved by the Board of Governors.
